Day 1 Morning

Tokaido Shinkansen from Tokyo to Shin-Osaka Change to Osaka Metro Arrival at Namba station Depart Namba by limited express Koya Arrival at Gokurakubashi. Cable car from Gokurakubashi to Koyasan

Day 4 Morning

Local bus to Nachizan Visit to Kumano Nachi Taisha shrine and Nachi falls



Local bus to Kii-Katsuura station Depart Kii-Katsuura by limited express Kuroshio



Arrival at Shin-Osaka and change to Tokaido Shinkansen Arrival at Tokyo station

The center of Shingon sect, an important Buddhist sect introduced to Japan in 805 by Kobo Daishi (also known as Kukai), one of Japan's most significant religious figures.

Shukubo - Temple lodging
