



## **Highlights**

## **Sleeper limited express Sunrise Seto**

One of the two daily regular night trains with sleepers operated in Japan. Sunrise Seto is connected with Sunrise Izumo, the other night train between Tokyo and Okayama stations.

#### **Naoshima**

One of the islands belonging to Naoshima islands, located offshore of Shikoku, belonging to Kagawa prefecture. The island is probably well know better to foreigners than Japanese living outside of Shikoku as "Art island".

## **Iya valley region**

A region in Tokushima prefecture, locating close to other three prefectures of Shikoku. Iya is a mountainous region with deep valley, known to local as one of the hidden places in Japan. A simple suspension bridge only for pedestrian built by woods and hardy kiwi vines, Iya no Kazura bridge is located here.

## **Udatsu townscape**

Udatsu townscape is located in Wakimachi district of Mima city in western Tokushima. Wakimachi was a trading distribution center of Japanese indigo.

#### Mt. Bizan

Probably the most popular tourist destination in Tokushima city, the prefectural capital of Tokushima prefecture. 290 meters high, you can enjoy the magnificent view of Tokushima and its surroundings from the top.

#### **Asa Coast Railway**

The first railway operator to operate world's first regular basis DMV, Dual-mode vehicle.

#### **DMV**

Dual-mode vehicle is a vehicle that can operate on conventional road surfaces as well as a railway track.

#### **Tour includes:**

Tour escort: English speaking tour escort will meet you at Tokyo station on day 1 and accompany you till day 4, terminating at Haneda airport.

Private car: Private car will be arranged on day 3 for sightseeing in Iya region. Vehicle size will be sedan for 2 persons, minivan for 3-4 persons.

Accommodation: 3/4 stars hotel in Takamatsu and in Tokushima. Twin/Double room basis. Single room can be booked with extra supplement.

Train tickets: Sleeper limited express Sunrise Seto from Tokyo to Takamatsu (Standard: 2<sup>nd</sup> class sleeper – you

can up grade to 1<sup>st</sup> class sleeper). JR Train ticket Takamatsu – Awa-Ikeda – Tokushima – Awa-Kainan, including limited express train supplement between Takamatsu and Awa-Ikeda. Return DMV ride between Awa-Kainan and Road station Shishikui onsen. JR train ticket from Awa-Kainan to Tokushima.

Ferry ticket: Return ferry ride between Takamatsu and Naoshima.

Bus ticket: Local bus in Naoshima. Airport bus from Tokushima station to Tokushima airport.

Flight ticket: Economy class flight ticket from Tokushima to Haneda.

Admission: Chichu art museum in Naoshima, toll for Iya no kazura bridge, return aerial tramway for Mt.Bizan.

If you want to enter any other tourist attractions in Naoshima, please advise before departure. We might can add it in the itinerary, including the admission.

Meal: Buffet breakfast on day 3 and day 4. You will have opportunities to have hot meals for breakfast (day 2), lunch and dinner on your expense, advised by tour escort on the spot.

Others:

Advised to bring backpack or carry-on suitcase. Large suitcase should be left at your hotel/residence in Tokyo.
